HIGHLIGHTS

- Indiana (IN) uses HPP funding to build and expand its preparedness and response network to support its 6.8 million residents.
- The Indiana Department of Health (IDOH) coordinated the receipt, storage, and disbursement of personal protective equipment (PPE) to health care coalitions (HCCs).
- The IDOH coordinated weekly calls to provide important and ever-changing information to Indiana hospitals.

SPOTLIGHT ON RESPONSE

Indiana HCCs coordinated the registration of Indiana health departments, hospitals, and emergency medical services into an online data management system. The system is used for daily reporting, tracking hospital capacity statewide, and ensuring timely HCC partner response by supporting situational awareness across each of the ten Indiana districts. The data system shows current bed capacity, ventilator capacity, and staffing shortages. Indiana HCCs strengthened current relationships and facilitated new partnerships to ensure successful emergency preparedness and response.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

- IN HCCs continue to serve in a critical information sharing role by streamlining communication between partners regarding COVID-19 response, infectious diseases, and threat preparedness.
- The IDOH collaborated with state agencies to coordinate response efforts and assist with proper statewide communication.
- The IDOH offered mental health and COVID-19 services through the Be Well Crisis Helpline.
- Indiana enhanced 211, a resource call line to connect the public to resources.
