



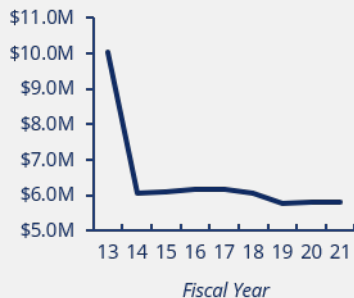

## MICHIGAN

### HPP FUNDING

**42% decrease in funding**  
since FY 2013



### HIGHLIGHTS

- Michigan (MI) uses HPP funding to build and expand its preparedness and response network to support its nearly 10.1 million residents.
- The eight MI health care coalitions (HCCs) aided in response and community resiliency by fostering collaboration among health care, emergency management, public health departments, hospice providers, and more.
- The MI HCCs supported communication, situational awareness, and response efforts through electronic, online platforms.

### SPOTLIGHT ON RESPONSE

The rapid spread of COVID-19 caused supply chain disruptions, which lead to a dramatic increase in the demand for personal protective equipment (PPE). The Region 2 North Healthcare Coalition worked with MI local authorities to enact a plan for county emergency management organizations to lead the warehousing and distribution of PPE. The HCC implemented a successful process for storing, ordering, and distributing PPE in addition to managing PPE-related communications and staffing efforts across three MI counties. These efforts established key partnerships for both current and future responses.

### COVID-19 RESPONSE

- Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) utilized an online platform for mass fatality resources for a six-week activation to offset management of decedents.
- MDHHS distributed PPE, ventilators, high-flow units, and other resources through HCCs to over 450 skilled nursing facilities, 150 hospitals, 4,500 elder care facilities, 800 emergency medical services agencies, and more.
- MDHHS utilized an online platform to report daily hospital and weekly skilled nursing facility data, as required.
- MDHHS increased the timely assessment and sharing of essential elements of information among preparedness and response partners using electronic platforms developed through HPP.
