HPP HIGHLIGHTS

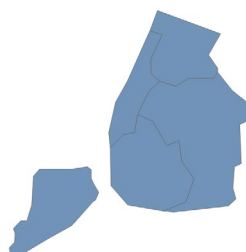
- New York City (NYC) uses HPP funding to build and maintain a strong emergency preparedness and response foundation for the city's 8.8 million residents.
- The NYC Health Care Coalition (NYCHCC) instructed facilities on the design, development, execution, and evaluation of exercises in long-term care.
- The NYCHCC aided end-stage renal disease patients and dialysis center providers by producing and distributing a personal preparedness training video for dialysis.

HPP SPOTLIGHT ON RESPONSE

The NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DOHMH) implemented a successful health care liaison program to support acute and long-term care facilities throughout the pandemic response. The health care liaison program supported these facilities by monitoring, reviewing, and resolving operational issues and requests related to space, staff, and resources. The health care liaison program developed innovative solutions to meet the multifaceted needs of health care partners.

COVID-19 RESPONSE

- NYC DOHMH distributed >376,000 pulse oximeters to hospitals, small independent practices, independent pharmacies, home care, Federally Qualified Health Centers, and urgent care centers.
- NYC DOHMH educated HCC stakeholders on monoclonal antibody therapies and developed a treatment locator website.
- NYC DOHMH compared the ASPR emPOWER data set against the citywide immunization registry to inform patient outreach and connections to homebound vaccination programs or Vaccine Hub appointments.
