



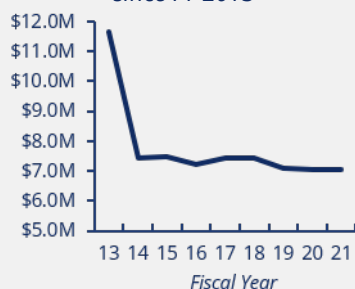

### HPP FUNDING

#### 39% decrease in funding since FY 2013



### HIGHLIGHTS

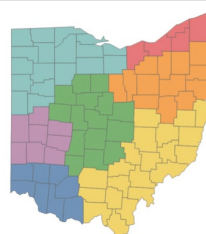
- Ohio (OH) uses HPP funding to build and maintain a strong emergency preparedness and response foundation for the state's 11.8 million residents.
- The Central Healthcare Coalition discussed promising practices for vaccine distribution, monoclonal antibody clinics, and visitor restrictions through Clinical Best Practice webinars.
- The North-East Central Ohio Healthcare Coalition aided patient transfers through the establishment of a Communication Hub.
- The OH Department of Health (ODH) released an Advanced Burn Life Support online training to mitigate burn incidents.

### SPOTLIGHT ON RESPONSE

OH health care coalition (HCC) members helped locate resources and supplies for West Central Ohio Regional Hospital. The hospital was overwhelmed and needed supplies such as ventilators, tubing, respiratory therapy solutions, oxygen, and blue top blood tubes to care for patients. The hospital's sourcing staff worked with the Emergency Preparedness team, HCC members, and emergency management agencies to successfully locate the supplies needed. The effort created an effective strategy in delivering supplies to other hospitals in need.

### COVID-19 RESPONSE

- The Northeast Ohio Healthcare Coalition worked with hospitals and academic centers to administer a survey to all long-term care facilities and other congregate living facilities to gather information on needs.
- The Northeast Ohio Healthcare Coalition obtained over \$700,000 in cached supplies and 1,100 cots from the warehouse, which were purchased with ASPR funds and delivered to hospitals to create alternate care sites for COVID-19 patients.
- The Northwest Healthcare Coalition distributed over 200 backup ventilators and pieces of respiratory protection equipment to all 33 hospitals throughout the region while assisting hospitals with requesting resources from the state.
